SWISD Counselors and Social Workers help students develop their social, emotional, and academic skills so that each student might maximize his/her potential. SWISD Counseling and Guidance has adopted the American School Counselor Association and the Texas Education Agency's model of Guidance and Counseling Services. This model is developmental in nature. As the child grows and develops into a young adult, so do the services of the school counselor. Daily we help students deal with the structures of school life, academic expectations, and career planning. We encourage them to set goals that will enable them to pursue career and/or post-secondary training opportunities in their areas of interests and talents. High School Counseling Program

High School counselors:

- Provide direct counseling services to students individually and in support groups.
- Provide education and support services to parents.
- Provide consultation services to teachers.
- Advise students on academic planning.
- Provide career guidance to students.
- Provide career information to parents.
- Network with post-secondary schools.
- Serve on school and community committees addressing the needs of young adults.
- Assist students and parents with post-secondary applications, testing requirements, scholarships, and financial aid information.

Middle School Counseling Program

Middle School counselors:

- Provide direct counseling services to students individually and in support groups.
- Help young adolescents learn to manage and organize information.
- Help young adolescents make choices and deal with change.
- Help young adolescents create educational plans and set educational goals.
- Help young adolescents develop positive attitudes toward lifelong learning and the world of work.
- Help young adolescents experience career exploration activities.
- Help parents and teachers create a positive learning environment.

Elementary School Counseling Program

Elementary School counselors:

- Provide direct counseling services to students individually and in support groups.
- Help students develop a better understanding and acceptance of themselves.
- Help students cope with family changes.
- Help students develop decision making and problem solving skills.
- Help students develop socially, emotionally, and to mature in their relations with others.
- Help students to understand themselves in relation to their own development.
- Help parents understand their children's emotions, behaviors, and learning styles, and assist them in meeting their child's needs.
- Help school staff, teachers, and administrators understand and meet the needs of all students in intellectual, personal, and social/emotional areas.

- Help parents and teachers create a positive learning environment.

School Social Workers

SWISD Social Workers enhance student learning by providing services which strengthen home, school, and community partnerships. They use their training and professional knowledge to address barriers within the child, home, school, and community that may be interfering with student achievement. School Social Workers collaborate with the School Counselor(s) on the campus to meet student needs. School Social Workers are able to assist students and their families through early identification, prevention, counseling, support, and advocacy.

School Social Workers:

- Provide direct counseling services to students individually and in support groups.
- Provide education and support services to parents.
- Provide consultation services to teachers.
- Help students cope in times of crisis.
- Help students maintain regular school attendance.
- Help students become resilient, successful learners.
- Help students gain personal and social competencies.
- Support parents to help them actively participate in their child's education.
- Support parents to access school and community resources.
